



























































































Chloe " I am happy because you have booked my theory driving test"

like consent, harassment, and discrimination. **4.Educates and Informs**: They provide essential information and education about healthy relationships, sexual health, and rights, empowering individuals to make informed decisions.

5.Legal Compliance: Ensures that the organization complies with relevant laws and regulations, protecting both the organization and its members.

This is what the Judges said:

Alisha is an expert by experience her poem moved me about her experience and how she is advocating to make sure people know and understand how hard it is for vulnerable people to share their experiences.

Even if someone doesn't want to help themselves, others do want to help. Her main goal is to support people in whatever way they need, even if they don't always know exactly what to do. Alisha is doing better and has more patience and time to help others. She has become more self-aware and lives in a block of flats with seven other residents who have become friends, supporting each other through their journeys.

Alisha noticed how it's okay not to be okay, and that it's important to express emotions. She always apologises, but she's learned to understand that bad things happen and that they don't define her. Alisha's progress has been amazing; she participates in group therapy and has grown so much that she's now able to talk to us openly.

Alisha faced significant challenges in education, being out of school for six years. Despite this, she passed every exam in her Health and Social course. No one believed in her initially, but she was brave enough to go back to college, being open and honest about her needs. She wants to be an advocate to help others and is very opinionated (in a good way) about the right things. Her passion for getting things right is inspiring.

Alisha is intelligent, articulate, and very strong. Her journey has been long and hard, but she hasn't given up. This experience has reinforced the importance of support, understanding, and the strength found in shared struggles. Your story is inspiring so please keep spreading awareness and support for others going through similar experiences.


